

### Children of John Honeyman

JOHN HONEYMAN'S Signature (taken from his will) was as follows:

Some, but certainly not all, of the children of John Honeyman were born at Griggstown, N.J. and were seven in number. No baptismal records, with one exception, or family Bible dates, have been discovered, so that the dates of birth of some of these children cannot be stated. The known dates, however, are given in Part II of this work.

**1. Jane**, born 1764, who never married, and who died in 1836, at age 70. She was a tall, stately woman. Large in frame and badly club-footed in both feet. She was a dressmaker, but had grace of manners and intelligence beyond her other sisters. She is the Aunt Jane named in Judge Van Dyke's narrative.

**2. Margaret**, born in 1767, died in 1821; married, first to William Henry and second to, George Armstrong. Lived in the vicinity of Lamington but had various residences while Mrs. Armstrong.

**3. John**, born in 1769 died in 1830 age sixty, a farmer had six sons, residing near the parental home, married Catherine Covert, descendants, son I William Honeyman married Jan Lozier, grds. John VanZant Honeyman married Catherine Secor, gtgrands Benjamin DePue Honeyman married Sarah Geimer, grt,grt,grnds Benjamin William Honeyman married ??

Grt,grt,grt,grndd. daughter Linda Claire Honeyman Brooks. Other living descendants are Rev. Melvin Honeyman, of Olean, N.Y., Rev. Robert M. Honeyman, of Norristown, Pa.

**4. Eleanor**, born 1772 died? Married abt 1795 in Hunterdon Co. Griggstown N.J. to Abram (Abraham) Porter, born 1773 died in Utica Mich. 1841 removed to Ossian township near Dansville N. Y. in early 1800's

**5. James**, b.1776 d.1824 age forty -eight of New Germantown, N. J. , famous as an Inn-keeper and teller of anecdotes, who married Mary Miller of Warren Co., He was the father of Dr. John Honeyman and Robert Honeyman, merchant, both of New Germantown.

**6. Sarah**, b.1780 d. 1845, wife of Abraham Van Dyke. She was the mother of Judge Van Dyke, of the New Jersey Supreme Court, and grandmother of Rr. John C. Van Dyke, the famous author and litterateur, of New Brunswick, N.J., and of Theodore S. Van Dyke, also an author on note, of California.

**7. Mary**, who married Mathias Lane, also resided in Bedminster township N. J. Her husband is said to have rented farms, but did not own any. Mary was known as the "Beauty" being an exceedingly handsome woman. Their descendants all went West, and disappeared from knowledge of their relatives.
